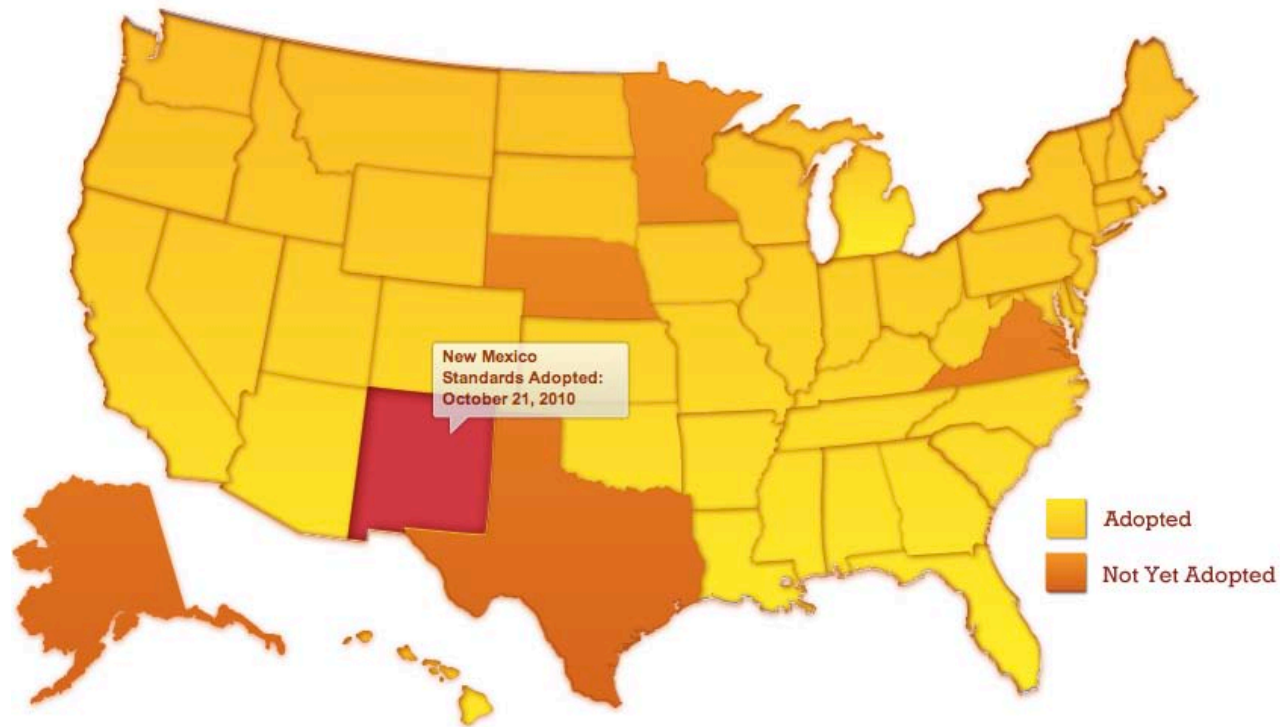

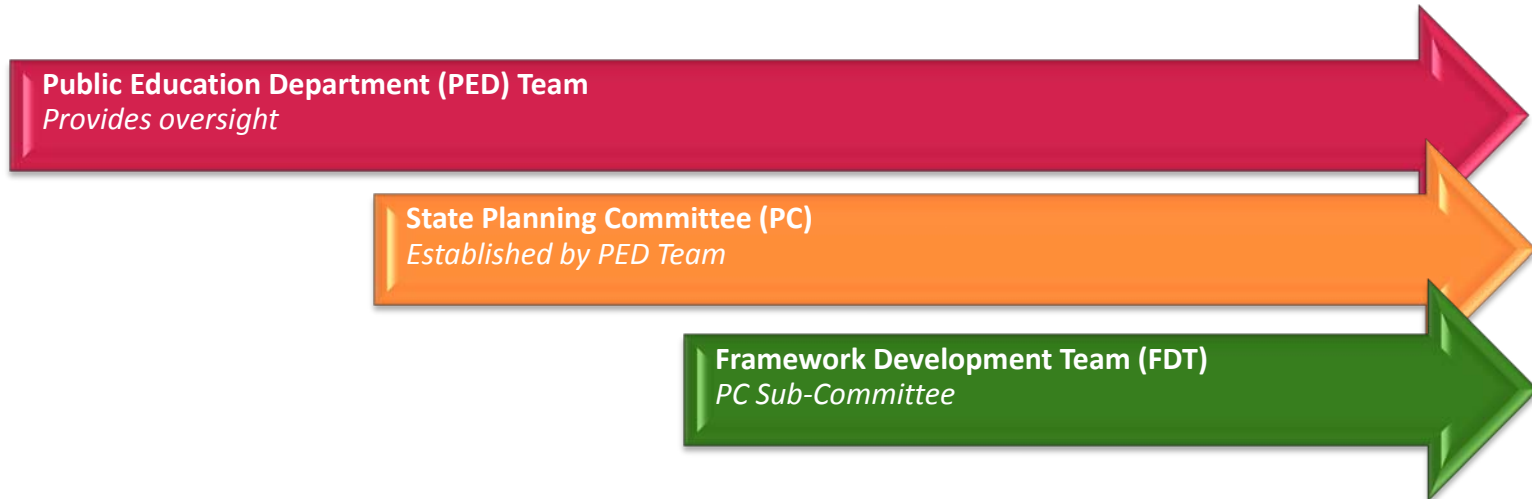
Creating the Plan

- \$350,000 Grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation to create our CCSS implementation plan
- July 2011- January 31, 2012

West Ed. Alignment Study

- West Ed. performed an alignment study between the New Mexico standards and the CCSS
- West Ed. created a user friendly summary report to share the biggest shifts in each grade caused by the implementation of CCSS
- Results will be provided with the implementation plan January 31, 2012

Stakeholder Involvement

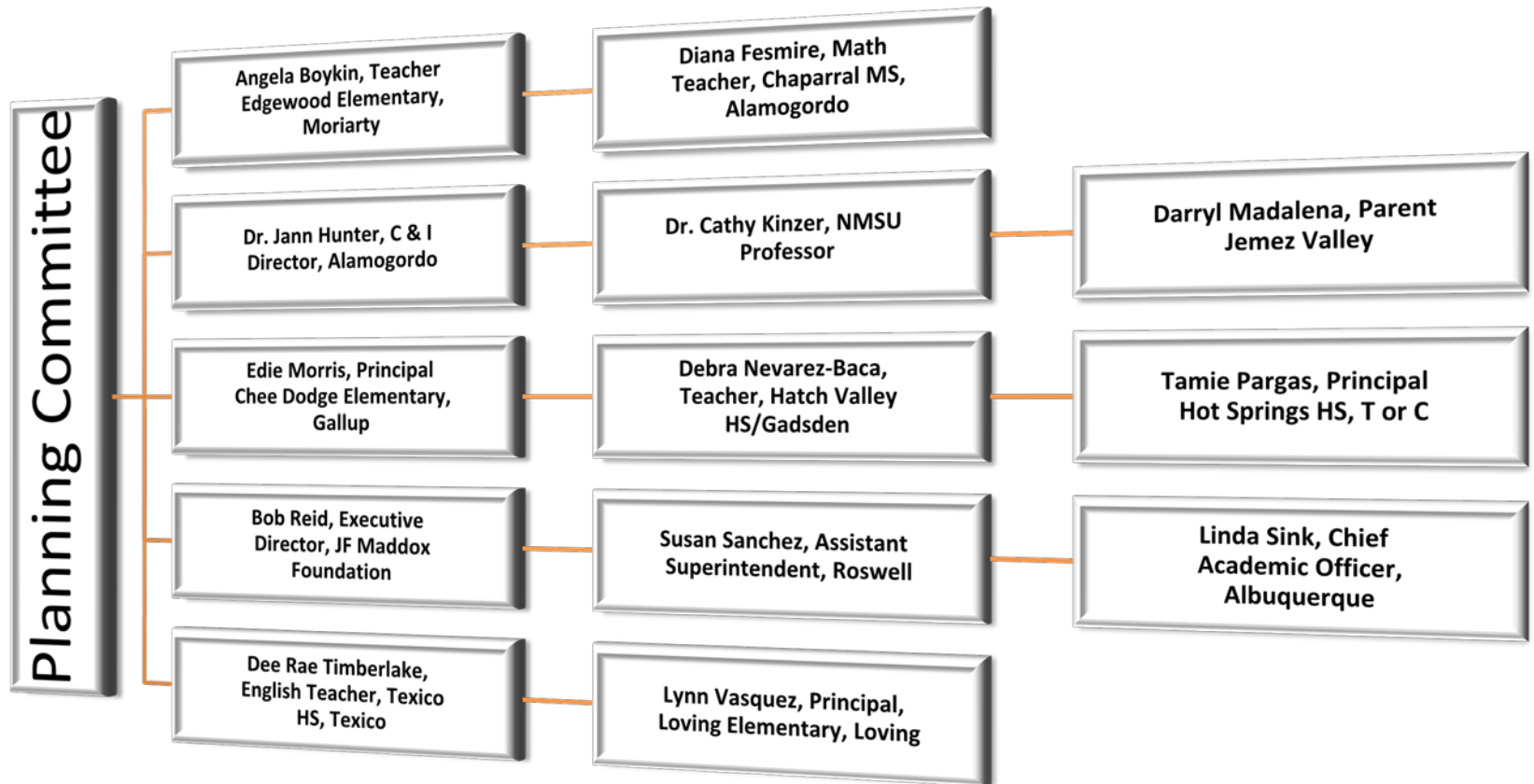




Role of the Planning Committee

- Met between August and January
- Create recommendations for the implementation plan to NMPED and the Framework Development Team
- Review drafts of the implementation plan
- Provide feedback and edits to the implementation plan

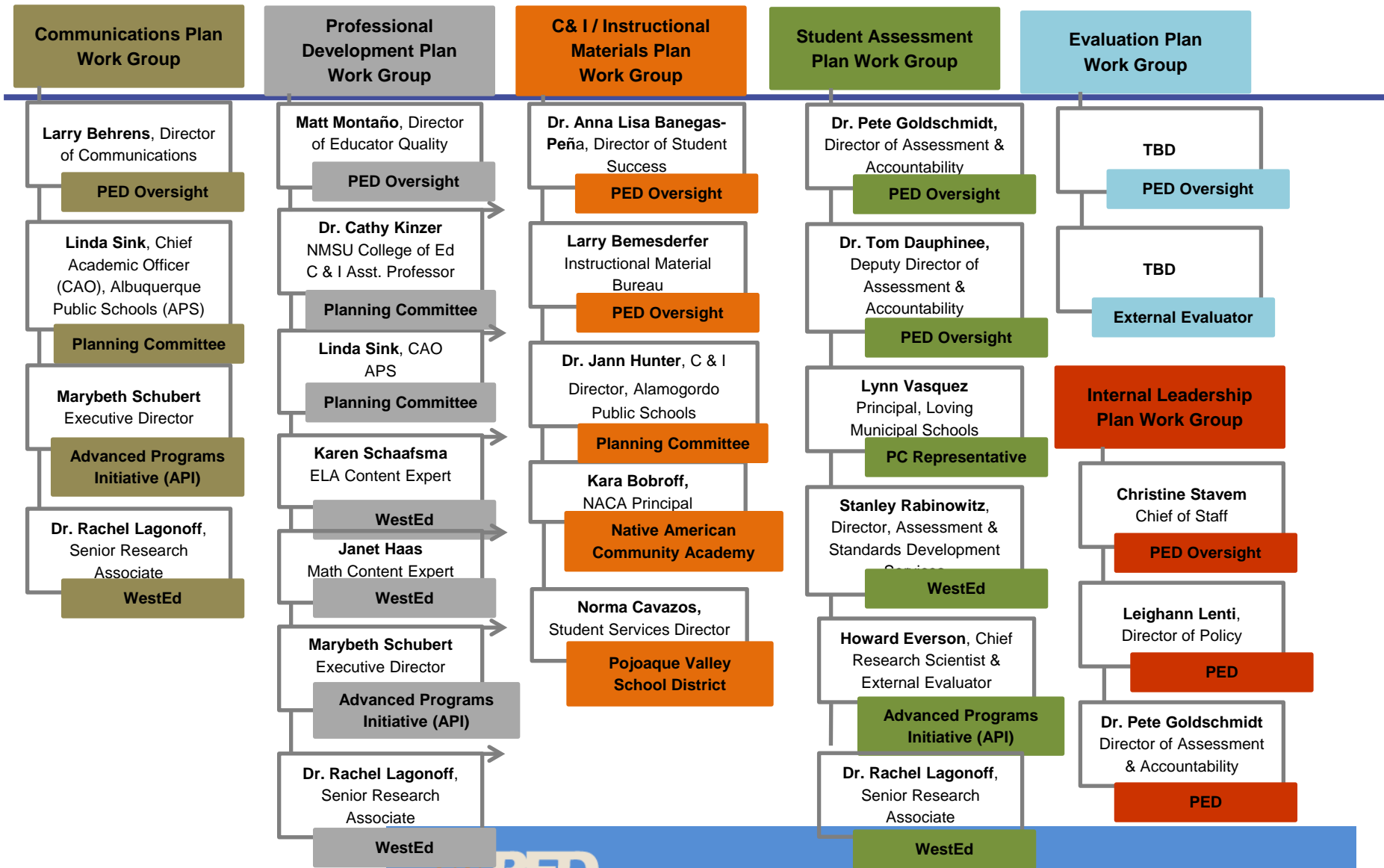
Planning Committee



Role of the Framework Development Team

- Met between November and January
- Use the recommendations of the Planning Committee to draft the implementation plan
- Submit drafts of the implementation plan to NMPED and the Planning Committee for review

Framework Development Team



Role of NMPED

- Provide oversight on each section of the plan
- Meet with experts from West Ed., the Advanced Programs Initiative and other contractors to receive input and feedback on the plan
- Edit and review each draft of the plan
- Provide continuous feedback
- Finalize plan, submit to the Kellogg Foundation and share with districts


Results

- Final stages of editing the implementation plan
- Planning Committee has reviewed draft plan and provided feedback and edits
- Plan will be released January 31, 2012
- Plan will be used to request additional funding for implementation from the Kellogg Foundation and the legislature
